ADMISSION EXAM: VERIFICATION OF LANGUAGE SKILLS FOR FOREIGN CITIZENS

Foreign citizens must demonstrate that they have a good knowledge of the Italian language; to verify their linguistic competence, candidates will undergo an Italian exam. The level of linguistic competence required is not lower than B1 for the bachelor (triennio) period and B2 for the master (biennio), referring to the CEFR (Common European Framework of References for Languages, Common European Framework of Reference for the knowledge of languages) issued by the Council of Europe. Failure to pass the test prevents enrollment in any first or second level academic study course.

Candidates must present themselves with a valid identity document.

Non-EU citizens residing abroad who possess one of the following qualifications are exempted from the Italian language exam: high school diploma issued at the end of 4-5 years of course by Italian schools based abroad ; secondary school diploma issued by the Republic of Argentina together with the so-called complementary certificate attesting to attendance at a secondary school course including the study of Italian for at least 5 years; Italian language and culture diploma issued by the two Universities for Foreigners of Perugia and Siena at the end of a course of study of at least one year; diploma of competence in Italian, issued by the University of Roma Tre or by the Universities for Foreigners of Perugia and Siena and corresponding to a level not lower than B1 of the CEFR (Common European Framework of References for Languages, Common European Framework of Reference for the knowledge of languages) issued by the Council of Europe. These diplomas can also be issued following specific agreements with Italian Cultural Institutes abroad or with other organizations; certificate of attendance of Italian courses issued by other Italian universities that have set up their own Italian language courses independently or in collaboration with other educational institutions or with regional and local authorities. The certified degree of linguistic competence must correspond to levels not lower than B1 of the CEFR (Common European Framework of References for Languages) issued by the Council of Europe; PLIDA certification of linguistic competence (Dante Alighieri Italian Language Project) issued by the Dante Alighieri Society; a qualification obtained in Slovenia, Croatia and Switzerland at public schools, where language course is taught in Italian. These qualifications are accepted as long as in the country to which they refer they are valid for admission to courses similar to those for which enrollment is requested in Italy.
